Stopbanks

The Opus survey and Geotech tests on the area stop bank issues in the Bowergate property have been completed and the results should be available for this meeting. The districts stop bank improvement works will be determined with the opus come of these results

Floodgates

Both floodgate 53 and 54 replacements were completed by Barfoote Contracting by the end of December 2017. Once again works were of a high standard and completed promptly.

The contract price for Flood gate 53 was \$103,500.00. Extra costs involved with Flood gate 53 were a cost variation of \$\$3,857.00 for a wider box culvert floor, roof and head wall. (The fabricated precast head wall head already made was used on Flood gate 54)

Temporary repairs made to Flood gate 53 for materials and labour were \$1224.00. Costs for the temporary flood gate installed (mainly freight) were \$2,582.00 with the installation and removal included in the Barfoote contract price for the temporary bund in front of the Flood gate.

Repairs to the road were \$6,980.00 which included an extension to the culvert under the road intidrain No55 were invoiced to the roading budget.

An extra 390 ton of lime stone stripping's @\$2,552.00 was required to build up the stop bank area approaching and over the top of the flood gate

The contract price for Flood gate 54 was within budget at 110,876.00. Extra costs were a new flood gate door including sand blasting and painting @ \$2,200.92



An extra 319 ton of lime stone stripping's @\$2,145.00 was required to build up the stop bank area approaching and over the top of the flood gate

Round one of this year's contract drain spraying has been completed @ 435,307.00 which also include Bull Rush spraying on the western side of K canal below SH12. The eastern side is to be spray from SH12 to Flood gate No 66 (Evans) when the digger has cleared access.

Summary

This report summarises the work that has been undertaken over the last month and work that is planned or recommended in the forthcoming months. The Committee is asked to receive the report.

Recommendation

That the Raupo Drainage Committee receives the Land Drainage Co-ordinator's report 'Asset Management Report: May 2018 dated 26 April 2018. This will enable the Committee to be informed of the current issues.

Background

The Raupo Drainage Committee meets four times each year to consider maintenance and renewal works that are required in the Raupo Drainage District. The Land Drainage Co-ordinator's report summarises the maintenance and renewal work that has been done over the period and outlines the future work programme.

Stopbanks

The Opus survey and Geotech results for the Bowergate stopbank solution have been forwarded to Wilson Earthmoving, Harrison Contracting and Barfoote Construction for alternative methodology and pricing. To date one reply (Harrison Contracting) has been received. Further replies should be available for discussion at this meeting.

Work has been completed on further raising and widening of the stopbank area between Wilson Landing Road and Simpson Road. A late start to this programme due to the possibility of works starting on the Bowergate stopbank, has resulted in the limestone strippings being wetter than normal this year. This has resulted in a tractor being required to roll the limestone in as it has been spread. This section of the stopbank has required substantial fill as the berm and paddock areas are lower than what has been previously done. A breakdown of costs and distance covered will be provided at this meeting. Reinstatement of the running track area has also been completed.

Lands and Survey has completed a GPS survey of stopbank heights (at 50 to 60 metre intervals) from floodgate No 8 (Simpson/Scott properties) to SH12 (L Canal), floodgate No 9 Naumai Wharf Road (Aspinal) to floodgate No 2 (Gent property). Also floodgate No 1 (Muddymouth) to floodgate No 47 (Simpson Road). These results will be available at this meeting for discussion.

CALIPARADISTRICT

Railway iron has been purchased to replace wooden posts to re-install the gates to the stopbank prior to winter.

Floodgates

Inspections have continued with debris removal required in floodgates No 1 and No 38 this quarter.

Repairs have been made to the floodgate No 33 wingwalls and breast works. Poles have been tied back, new timber installed with a concrete slurry poured behind and in front of the outlet. New door face timbers are to be replaced, and a new door fabricated.

Floodgate No 1 (Muddymouth) has had the outer timber breast removed due to water seepage over big tides. During the installation of the new concrete wingwalls, the decision was made to leave the outer timber wingwalls in place, so as not to upset the foundation in front of the floodgate. This proved unsatisfactory as tidal water ran around the timber wall and through joints in the new concrete wingwall that could not be grouted. This area has been compacted with limestone strippings and the bank built up to the correct height. Reinstatement of the limestone access track to the floodgate was completed at this time.

Drain spraying

Round two of the district's drain spraying is presently underway. Access in lower K Canal from SH12 to floodgate No 66 (Evans) has been completed to allow bullrush spraying on the eastern side. Bullrush spraying will also be required on G canal below Sunrise Bridge (Double Creek).
